


### The Diesel Engine - Continued **From March Issue Bv** Wendell Noble

This is the reverse of the compression stroke but now at a higher pressure. Between points 4 and 1 the chamber is allowed to exhaust to reduce the pressure at a constant volume. If you remember from high school science, work is force applied over a distance. During the power stroke, the pressure inside the cylinder provides a force on the piston as it moves downward. The amount of work done as the piston moves down an increment is proportional to the pressure times the volume. To put a number on it requires some higher math, but the important point is that the greater the range in volume between V1 and V2, the greater the work. Now let us be clear about what we mean by efficiency. In simple terms, efficiency is the ratio of what we get to what we put in. What we put in is the energy released by the burning fuel. What we get is the net of the work done by the power stroke minus the work done by the compression stroke. Refering to the p-V diagram, the work going into the cylinder during compression is the area under the curve between points 1 and 2. The work out of the engine is in the areas represented by the enclosed area. The ration of V1 to V2 is the compression ratio. If for any particular value of V1, we make V2 smaller, the net work out is increased because the enclosed area is increased and the compression ration is higher. If the amount of fuel burned is kept the same, the efficiency is increased. This answers our first and hardest question as to why a higher compression results in greater efficiency.

Now for the easy question as to why a diesel engine has a higher compression ratio. It does because it can. Most of us know what happens if we try to increase the compression ratio of a gasoline engine. Since the fuel and air are mixed before going into the cylinder, the fuel can be ignited before the piston gets to the top dead center by heat compression. edge. The heat energy is wasted trying to push the piston down at the wrong time, the engine "pings" and we loose efficiency. Diesel's invention was in figuring out how to increase the compression ratio without being limited by pre-ignition. His solution should seem obvious to us today: fuel is injected into the combustion chamber under higher pressure as the piston gets to top dead center and is ignited by the high temperature of the already compressed air. Diesel had ambitious goals for his engine. Since the compression ratio was not limited to pre-ignition, he envicloser to 7:1 for a gasoline engine using regular gas. The reality of today is something more like to 20:1 for the diesel engine. Because the diesel cycle is not susceptible to pre-ignition, a greater variety of fuels can be used. Diesel even envisioned a coal dust fuel. He even had a little success although, practical reliable fuel delivery system proved elusive. My description of the thermodynamics of the internal combustion en-

gine operation is definitely over simplified and leaves out the math and equations needed to put actual numbers on things. It also leaves out consideration for friction and heat transfer details. If I include all that stuff you may not understand it and neither would I. What I hope I did accomplish was to explain why a diesel engine is more efficient than a gasoline engine. The remaining question is why we aren't using more of them has got to be answered by someone else.

### Sunday, April 25 - Dust Off Tour And **Meeting At The Sander's Garage Complex**


There will be a short tour starting at the Sander's garage in Jeffersonville at 11 AM. It will continue over short scenic routes and return to the garage by 12 noon.

Dear Sheila

A car stalling after being driven a short distance can be caused by a variety of faults with the engine. Start by checking that there is no debris in the fuel line. If it is clear, check the vacuum pipes and hoses on the intake manifold and also check all grounding wires. If none of these approaches solves the problem, it could be that the fuel pump itself is faulty, causing low delivery pressure to the injectors.
