
Updated post script. Shock absorber rebuild.

The transmission is the Chrysler early attempt at an automatic. It has a fluid drive clutch, column shifter like a standard and a four speed automatic with two speeds in each of two ranges. It has power brakes which needed complete rebuilding including the vacuum booster and extremely fast power windows which all work but didn't then. The paint was severely oxidized and showing primer in some places such that making it shiny again ruled out any sanding or buffing compound. Lot's of

wax!!!! The tires were the second set of tires with one of the original tires in the trunk. The tires all held air!!! The car was featured as the "Drivable Dream" in the November, 2008 issue of Hemmings Classic car magazine and was invited, with me to the Hemmings New Eng-



land Concourse in 2008. The car now has over 24,000 miles on it and draws stares, waves and thumbs up everywhere we go with it. It is a large car with a very soft ride with huge leg room in the back seat. At the 2009 Stowe car show we were awarded the Kenneth Sherrer Memorial Trophy which is awarded to a VAE member. The trophy has a working model of a Stanley Steamer on top which has delighted my Grandchildren. I will be sad to see the trophy leave the house and go to the next recipient who I hope will be as proud of it and as grateful as I have been. Dan's granddaughter **Trinity Smith** (Rutland) is holding the VAE inhouse *Kenneth Sherrer Trophy* and her friend *Sarah Barker*.

So folks, this is a wonderful opportunity to help make the retirement years of others more meaningful. Consider taking the automotive books that you are finished with to a retirement community.


Champlain Valley Fair Parade

Another Mystery Solved!


In an earlier issue of WheelTracks, there was a photograph of a young boy with his father standing next to a Tornado.

SEMA SECURES U.S. SENATE RESOLU-TION DESIGNATING JULY 9th AS "COLLECTOR CAR APPRECIATION DAY"

Lawmakers Acknowledge Importance of Collection and Restoration of Historic and Classic Cars

(Washington, D.C. - May 7, 2010) The United States Senate passed Senate Resolution 513 (S. Res. 513) at the request of the Specialty Equipment Market Association (SEMA) and the Automotive Restoration Market Organization (ARMO) Council designating July 9, 2010 as "Collector Car Appreciation Day." The resolution was the result of an effort undertaken by ARMO as a means to raise awareness of the vital role automotive restoration and collection plays in American society.

S. Res. 513 was sponsored by Congressional Automotive Performance and Motorsports Caucus members Senator Jon Tester (D-MT) and Senator Richard Burr (R-NC). Senators Tester and Burr have been strong advocates for the automotive hobby in Washington, and S. Res. 513 reaffirms their understanding of the cultural importance of collector cars. The Caucus is an informal, non-partisan group that pays tribute to America's ever growing love affair with the car and motorsports. The Caucus recognizes the integral role collector cars have played in fostering our nation's appreciation for motorsports.

The resolution was the result of an effort undertaken by SEMA and its councils as a means to raise awareness of the vital role automotive restoration and collection plays in American society. Restoration businesses help save our nation's heritage while providing well-paying, high-skilled jobs nationwide.

SEMA Vice President of Government Affairs Steve McDonald said, "We greatly appreciate the United States Senate's recognition of the important role classic car restoration serves in our country. As Americans gather at car cruises and other events in conjunction with 'Collector Car Appreciation Day' on July 9, these vital contributions will be honored and preserved."

In recognition of the day, collectors and enthusiasts will be hosting events across the country. Jim Barber, Chairman of SEMA's Automotive Restoration Market Organization (ARMO) Council said, "Individuals, car clubs, and businesses affiliated with ARMO are proud to be recognized as leaders in today's economy. Car cruises, club gatherings, and other educational events will be scheduled for July 9 nationwide. ARMO is looking forward to assisting with these events and is appreciative of this special acknowledgment by the Senate."

Dennis Overholser, Chairman of SEMA's Hot Rod Industry Alliance (HRIA) Council said, "HRIA's commitment to preserving and promoting the automotive restoration industry through its projects and education programs is well represented by this Resolution. We are pleased that our elected officials have acknowledged our positive presence in local communities. I look forward to working with other business owners, collectors, and enthusiasts to make the inaugural 'Collector Car Appreciation Day' a success nationwide."








Gasoline VS Water

(An opinion from a gent named Mike) From *Lloyd Davis*

My wife and I have two cars that have been very dependable and we have had them for quite a number of years. I always check the gasoline mileage (mpg) with every fill up so I am very familiar with what each car can produce.

About a year ago stickers began to appear on gasoline pumps announcing that the fuel is now 10% ethanol. It was at that time that I observed our mileage (mpg) had dropped by 10%. This was true for each car and was true whether for city or highway driving or for a combination of both.

Let me analyze what this means, assuming my results are typical of most other cars on the road. At this point most are not designed to run on Flex-fuel.

We have been led to believe that burning ethanol would lessen our dependence on foreign oil, save domestic oil, reduce environmental harm, and save money. It appears, however, that none of this is true.

When a gallon of fuel is purchased, the 10% of the cost that provides us with ethanol seems to yield no energy at all. They might as well have provided us with 10% of a gallon of empty space. So are we saving oil? Of course not. We must buy fuel 10% more often.

The number of barrels of oil used in America is exactly the same as it was before the ethanol was added. It cost us, however, 10% more. And environmental effects are not reduced. Why would the government perpetuate such a hoax? They probably wouldn't do it if fuel was sold tax free. But the worst part is that much of the corn and farmland that would have been used to feed people is now used to produce a fuel that is of no value. And the cost of farm produce goes up accordingly. We pay more for fuel and food and get nothing is return. So what can we use for fuel in place of oil products? I really don't have an answer to this. I remember reading from time to time that someone has devised a way to burn water in his automobile. I don't believe it, but even if it was true, it would not necessarily be such a good thing.

We are approaching the day when the nation's supply of drinking water will not be sufficient for our population. We may be running out of oil but wouldn't it be even worse if our water was being depleted by millions of barrels per day?

So, for now I would suggest that the use of ethanol for fuel be entirely voluntary. Don't force us to burn 10% ethanol unless we chose to do so because for most of us it is a waste of money and resources.

Gary Olney's 1906 Orient Buckboard

There are some mysteries I have been unable to find answers to but isn't that exactly how it should be?

This Orient Buckboard was built by the Waltham Manufacturing Company on Rumford Avenue in Waltham, Mass. Thanks to **Bill Sherk's** article in **'Old Autos'**, a publication printed in Bothwell, Ontario, a few of the mysteries have been solved. The auto...with its Mass. number plate..... made its way from Waltham to Antigonish, Nova Scotia when a jeweler purchased it (date unknown).

The story goes that the jeweler would often turn to swearing as he turned the crank because the car was so hard to start. At some point the jeweler made arrangements to store the Orient Buckboard and a 1912 Studebaker in an area barn owned by the grandfather of Mr. Gordon Penny. When the Studebaker was removed it is said the Orient was left as payment for storage. When Gordon was 14 years old in 1945 he found the Orient in his grandfathers barn...the Mass. plate was still attached....he pulled the Orient out and got it running. The story continues......in the early 1950s Gordon sold the Orient, in running condition, to Mr. Harry Olney of Springfield Vermont



Mr. Gordon still resides in Antigonish, Nova Scotia and when he was interviewed by Bill

Sherk he said he thought the Orient was now in Maine someplace. Well, guess what, the Orient resides in Derby, Vermont and is owned by Harry Olney's son Gary... the Orient still has its Mass.1908 plate #0237K.

There were about 2500 Orient Buckboards built and it is estimated 57 exist today, of which 45 are in the United States



The 1906 Orient was sold new for \$440 and was the first to have what is called **Friction Drive**, a wheel and disc that allows an infinite variation of speeds forward and reverse also allowing for much less vibration when driving. Top speed is 35 MPH and if you want to enter a race, special 'racing' sprockets can be installed to reach up to 40MPH. The engine produces **4 horsepower** and is air cooled. The car weight is 525 pounds with a wheelbase of 80 inches. The wheel track is 42 inches but can be changed to 56 inches which would allow it to fit into the **'standard wagon tread'**.

The serial numbers for the Orient Buckboard start at 450 because Numbers 1 to 450 had already been used for motorcycles and other cars the company built. I believe the plate of Gary's Orient has #570 on it. If you would like to hear an Orient run, go to this address on the internet... http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=R7wztpgfvaI. Or... just google 'Orient Buckboard' and you will find the demonstration.

If you ever get to Gary's barn where he keeps the Orient be sure to take a flash light and check out the details of the car closely, it is amazing......


