Member In The News - Peter Markowski

VAE member Peter Markowski of Restoration, Performance Motors

(RPM) in Vergennes, VT with his sons Eben and Stephan were featured in a recent article by Lauren Ober in the Seven Days newspaper. The story explain how Peter located a next to death Ferrari 212 in a barn in New Hampshire and 29 years later he finally talked the owner into selling him the car.

The car has now been totally restored to its original glory with a completely new body hand crafted by *Peter's* son *Eben*, who is an accomplished metal artist and metal worker. *Eben* considers this bodywork, a "work of art" in the old world fashion.

The car is ready and *Peter* with its owner will be traveling to Italy to run it in the *Mille Miglia*, in May, which is a fourday, 1,000 mile endurance road rally that travels through Bologna, Rome, Florence and Modena before ending in Brescia at the foot of the Italian Alps.

On my visit to RPM in late April I discovered a very busy shop and *Peter* told me that he had just returned from New York after delivering the car for shipment. (*Rats, I missed it.* gf)

Heat range of your spark plug...

The term spark plug heat range refers to the speed with which the plug can transfer heat from the combustion chamber to the engine

head. Whether the plug is to be installed in a boat, lawnmower or racecar, it has been found the optimum combustion chamber temperature for gasoline engines is between 500°C–850°C. When it is within



that range it is cool enough to avoid <u>pre-ignition</u> and plug tip <u>overheating</u> (which can cause engine damage), while still hot enough to burn off combustion <u>deposits</u> which cause <u>fouling</u>.


The spark plug can help maintain the optimum combustion chamber temperature. The primary method used to do this is by altering the internal length of the core nose, in addition, the alloy compositions in the electrodes can be changed. This means you may not be able to visually tell a difference between heat ranges. When a spark plug is referred to as a "cold plug", it is one that transfers heat rapidly from the firing tip into the engine head, which keeps the firing tip cooler. A "hot plug" has a much slower rate of heat transfer, which keeps the firing tip hotter.

An unaltered engine will run within the optimum operating range straight from the manufacturer, but if you make modifications such as a turbo, supercharger, increase compression, <u>timing</u> changes, use of alternate racing fuels, or sustained use of <u>nitrous</u> oxide, these can alter the plug tip temperature and may necessitate a colder plug. A rule of thumb is, **one heat range colder per modification** or one heat range colder for every 75–100hp you increase. In identical spark plug types, the difference from one full heat range to the next is the ability to remove 70°C to 100°C from the combustion chamber.

The heat range numbers used by spark plug manufacturers are not universal, by that we mean, a 10 heat range in Champion is not the same as a 10 heat range in NGK nor the same in Autolite. Some manufacturers numbering systems are opposite the other, for *domestic manufacturers* (Champion, Autolite, Splitfire), the *higher the number, the hotter the*

plug. For Japanese manufacturers (NGK, Denso), Terminal (shown w/nut) the higher the number, the colder the plug.

Do not make spark plug changes at the same time as another engine modification such as injection, carburetion or timing changes as in the event of poor results, it can lead to misleading and inaccurate conclusions (an exception would be when the alternate plugs came as part of a single precalibrated upgrade kit). When making spark plug heat range changes, it is better to err on the side of too cold a plug. The worst thing that can happen from too cold a plug is a fouled spark plug, too hot a spark plug can cause severe engine damage



The Continuing Saga of E-10

After hearing that non-E10 may be history later this summer, I contacted a petroleum industry source to get the name of the supplier of non-E10 into VT. He suggested Petro Canada, but he also said that the availability of non-E10 is dictated by the EPA as it studies the air quality in any given region. Essentially, cleaner the air the more non-E10 is available. Below is the reply from Petro Canada to my inquiry...

Good afternoon Gene Fodor, Thank you for your inquiry.

Currently the use of ethanol blended gasoline in Eastern Canada is very dependant upon the pro-

vincial requirements or regional marketing strategies. This makes it very difficult to identify individual stations that may or may not sell non-ethanol gasoline, as certain grades of gasoline may or may not contain ethanol.

In Quebec certain stations may sell non-ethanol blended 91 Octane Premium, but at a station where 94 Octane gasoline is available, the 91 Octane Premium will contain ethanol.

In the Maritimes currently all gasoline sold by Petro-Canada does not contain ethanol.

In the near future, 3 – 6 months, the Canadian Government will announce the Renewable Fuel Strategy which pertains to the ethanol content in gasoline. This will invariably change the landscape as to where non-ethanol gasoline and what grades of non ethanol gasoline are available.

Unfortunately our Site Locater information found on <u>www.Petro-Canada.ca</u> is not designed to be specific about non-ethanol or ethanol gasolines.

The only warning that is present at the sites is a yellow label affixed to the pump on the upper steel cladding above the pump top or on the pump itself (at older installations) warning "Gasoline may contain up to 10% Ethanol".


VAE IN THE MOVIES ...
















The warming spring sun shone and the rains stayed far south of Vermont. The food was great and the meeting informative and educational.

The regular quarterly Meeting of the VAE Board of Directors was held on Monday evening, April 5, 2010 at the Whitney Hill Retirement Community in Williston. The Meeting was called to order at 7:05 PM by Chairman Gene Fodor, who began by introducing Gary Fiske, who may be taking over all or part of the responsibility for Wheeltracks after Gene steps down at the end of this year.

Secretary's Report: Bill Sander moved, and David Sander

seconded, that the minutes of the prior Meeting be accepted as printed in Wheeltracks. This passed unanimously. Treasurer's Report: Dick Wheatley reported that there is about \$60.000 in our accounts. Sponsorship for Stowe has now reached \$2,850. Audit Committee Report

Re: Audit Committee meeting

This is to confirm that the VAE Audit Committee met with Treasurer

Dick Wheatley at Dick's office on February first. In attendance were Doris Bailey, Gael Boardman, Leo Laferriere, and Treasurer Wheatley. The purpose of the meeting was to conduct an audit of the VAE 2009 financial records.



We reviewed our prior committee report to the Board dated 8/21/08, and con-

firmed the procedures listed as A through G in the 2007 report are still in place. Doris Bailey continues to provide oversight of transactions through her at-home receipt of monthly bank statements.

We reviewed several records with Treasurer Wheatley, and discussed some current issues. We also sampled transactions for the month of August, 2009, confirming check numbers, amounts paid and supporting documentation.

In our opinion, the financial reports as presented for the year 2009 are in order and accurate. Attached as part of this report is a VAE 2009 Financial Summary, showing opening and closing account balances together with a statement of budgeted vs actual income and expenses.

Additionally, the following updates are noted:

The status change from 501(c)7 to 501(c)3 is well underway.

The financial agreement negotiated with the anonymous lender (to temporarily finance Stowe show start-up costs) was implemented. Only \$3,500 of the offered \$10,000 was used, the show was profitable, and the lender was repaid at the time the show closed.

It is noted that a significant portion of Stowe show profitability was due to great weather and an above-average level of volunteerism, with individuals foregoing income and/or reimbursement of personal expenses in exchange for building the club's financial strength.

A separate 2009 Stowe show account was established. This account was closed at year end, and the VAE will return to the prior practice of operating through one account. Although show income and expenses will be commingled with those of other club activities, the recordskeeping system will enable separate identification of show financial matters.

Chevrolet Suburban Marks 75 Years

ARLINGTON, Texas - The Chevrolet Suburban, the <u>roomy</u> choice of hunters, law enforcement agencies and soccer moms, celebrated its 75th anniversary in May as the longest continuously produced vehicle in the

The sport utility vehicle is only made at General Motors' Arlington plant, which showcased one of the first Suburbans ever produced — a boxy yellow version from 1936 with large round headlights and a spare tire on each side. The



interior featured a big steering wheel and spacious tan and dark brown vinyl seats that could be removed for storage space.

Unveiled as the Suburban Carryall more than seven decades ago, it could seat eight people comfortably and offered whitewall tires, a radio and heater as options. Unlike other 1930s cars that had wood sides and canvas tops, the early Suburban was designed as a more durable truck-type vehicle Through the years, engineers increased the Suburban's towing capacity, revised the design and upgraded the interior. It reached the height of its popularity in the 1990s when <u>SUVs</u> became the rage.

"The Suburban is the longest-running nameplate in the country, and that's a significant accomplishment that shows its great heritage," plant manager Paul Graham said.

GM on Monday also debuted the new 75th Anniversary Diamond Edition Suburban, which will be available this summer. Only 2,750 will be made

with an all-steel wagon body.NASCAR's Jimmie Johnson, who races in Chevy cars, drove one of the limited-edition Suburbans on Monday and later signed some autographs for several plant employees.

The anniversary came as GM and other automakers who received billions in a federal bailout have begun reporting gains.

GM recently began airing TV ads announcing its repayment of a \$6.7 billion government loan. The company later was criticized for not mentioning that most of the \$52 billion in federal aid to GM was converted into a 61 percent government ownership stake.

"We understand that some people were against the support that we got," said Alan Batey, vice president of Chevy's sales and service. But he said the company has attracted new customers because "we can produce the world's best vehicles."

Batey also said GM has had seven consecutive months of increased

The Texas plant, which has about 2,400 employees, has been on an overtime schedule to keep up with orders for the SUVs made there, Graham said. It's a major turnaround from last year, when GM closed 13 North American factories — including the Arlington plant — for two months to slash inventory.
